

Short presentation for introducing CG paper(s)

Let us introduce the papers published in SIGGRAPH 2016, the world's top conference in the field of CG and human-computer interface.

Procedure

- Introduce the assigned papers in no more than 10 minutes per person (6 people per one time period).
- Refer to the assignment sheet for the paper titles (2 papers per person).
- The presentation order is sequential from the top of the assignment sheet. Absentees and those who did not submit presentation materials will be omitted.

In case the assigned paper(s) are not available on the Internet, select other SIGGRAPH 2016 paper(s) by yourself. (<http://kesen.realtimerendering.com/sig2016.html>)

How to submit your introduction slide

- Slides for introduction should be Power Point or PDF files and submitted via manaba (<https://manaba.tsukuba.ac.jp/>) by 23:55 on 4th December (Friday).
After logging in to manaba, you must be registered in this course. If not, register yourself by entering the registration key "2511135" at the link destination of the early application.
- If you cannot submit in time or you are absent, you should give a presentation in the next week.
- If you want to use a movie for introduction, write the URL without including movie files in the uploaded file, and play it on the browser on the day.

How to give your presentation

- Minimize the use of videos and do not merely show the video in your presentation.
- In the first page of your slide, describe the title and author(s) of the papers, your student number and name.
- Use as many figures as possible in the slide.
- Explain what the novelties of the papers are and what advantages they have in the results so that the attendants can understand what the authors studied.
- Keep your presentation time strictly (within 10 minutes in total).

Evaluation

- The contents of the presentation will be evaluated. If you fail to keep the deadline, it will be subject to point deduction in evaluation.
- Because you might submit brief summaries of the assigned papers as a final report (3 pages for each paper at A4), read the assigned papers carefully.
